

Colonel's House



The most prominent building at Camp Casey is the beloved and iconic Colonel's House. It was completed in 1904 with a total cost of \$11,159.63. This 120-year-old Victorian home has been carefully preserved and is a favorite accommodation for small group retreats and reunions. Until 2024, it was rarely rented to outside parties, so an overnight stay is a unique opportunity.

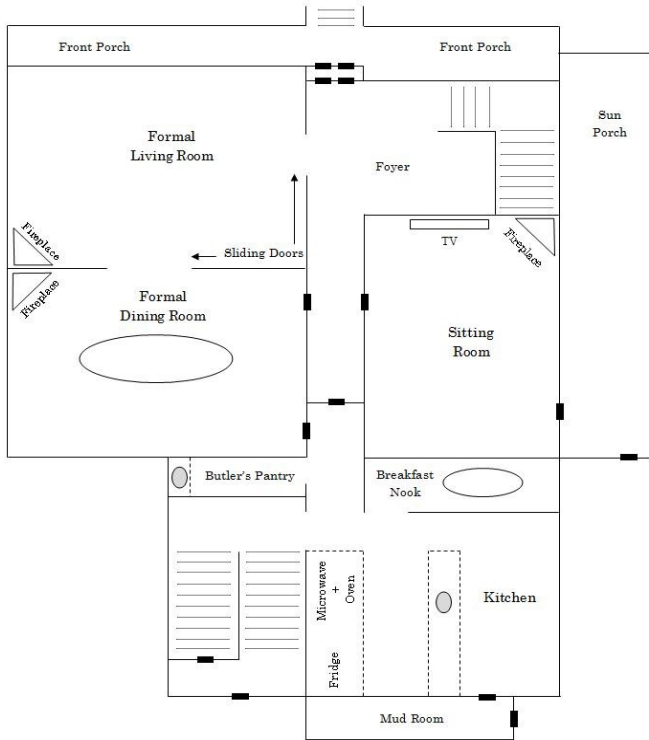
It has a total of 6 bedrooms and can sleep up to 16 people. The master bedroom has an attached master bath with sitting room and flat screen TV. The 4 story home has 3 bathrooms, all of which are on the 2nd and 3rd floors. Two of the three bathrooms have clawfoot tubs. The linens on the beds and in the restrooms are included. The kitchen includes a microwave, toaster, coffee pot and other kitchen cooking necessities. The lower level has a living room, formal dining room, sitting room with flat screen TV, butler's pantry, breakfast nook, full kitchen, mud room and a vast sun porch with tables and chairs. There are staircases at either end of the home. A large front porch with additional mud room completes this magnificent building.

Wi-Fi and Cable Television are provided. There is a working fireplace in the formal living room on the 1st floor, and logs for burning are provided.

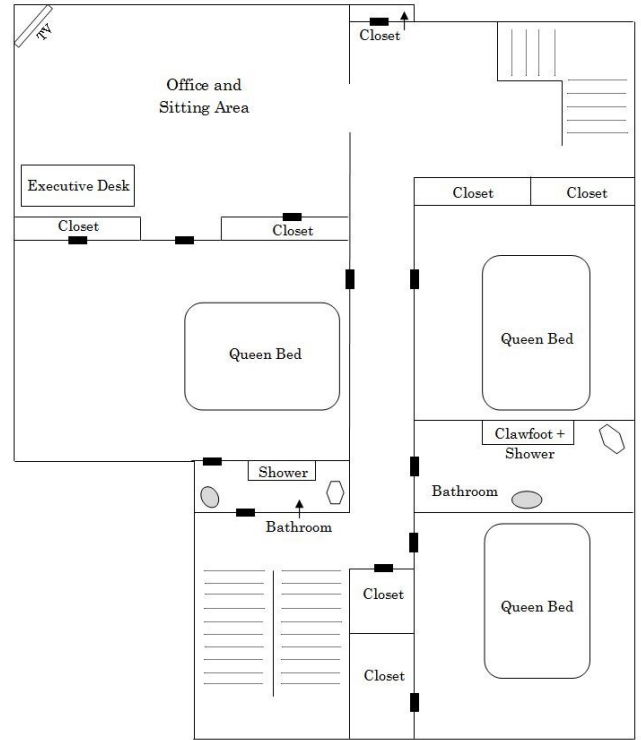
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Floor Plan
